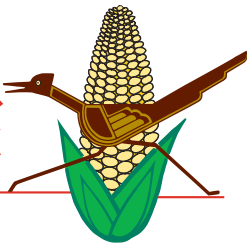

VOLUNTEERS: **ESSENTIAL TO ROADRUNNER FOOD BANK**

Volunteers make it possible for Roadrunner Food Bank to receive and transport more than 14 million pounds of food each year. Roadrunner distributes this food through a statewide network of six regional food banks and more than 700 emergency food pantries, group homes, low-income day care centers, shelters, and soup kitchens. In turn, these organizations provide emergency food boxes, meals, and direct food donations to 238,000 people per year.
